Motion by Davenport, 2nd by Stayton to approve June 27, 2016 minutes as corrected, and approve July 18, August 15, August 29 and September 6, 2016 as written. Motion carried.

AB 16-44 Resolution 2016-004 Fee Increase

Motion by Minshall, 2nd by Getto to approve the fee increase resolution 2016-004 effective October 1, 2016. Motion carried.

AB 16-45 Ordinance 233 FY 17 Budget Appropriation Ordinance

STAFF REPORTS:

City Clerk – the city has been contact by a Horizon Communications for a cell tower possibility, stated that the rent could be 650-750 per month and rent escalators as the term progresses. Clerk requested the heat be exchanged out in the Community Center. The retro-fit of the downtown street lights will not be completed as it is not cost prohibited now. Tenant will be moving out of the Depot Center for the month of October to have the repairs completed. We will notify them as soon as they can move back in. Cross training has begun with Shannon and Rene. This is going smoothly. ABC has donated a bus kiosk and will begin construction soon. Hunter's Meadow is now open for dinner only.

AB 17-01 Proposal for Grant Administrative Services

A RFP was sent to 3 grant administrators. Two withdrew and one submitted proposal. This would be for grant administration for the CDBG through the Idaho Department of Commerce and USDA Rural Development Grants.

<u>Motion by Minshall, 2nd by Getto</u> to accept Clearwater Economic Development Association's proposal from grant administration and development. Motion carried.

AB 17-02 Resolution 2016-005 Surplus

<u>Motion by Davenport, 2nd by Stayton</u> to adopt Resolution 2016-005 Surplus for the Oil Furnace tank with a value of \$25.00. Motion carried.

AB 17-03 Resolution 2016-006 Inter Fund Loan for Depot Repairs

Clerk presented the Resolution to borrow money from other funds to fund the entire repair project for the Donnelly Depot Center. The total repairs came to \$171xxx. Insurance provided \$100,000 and the City is required to fund the remainder. The Depot Center has a balance of \$21,000 in savings that will be used. The General Fund has \$50,000 in savings that it can also use but that will deplete all reserves for the General Fund. It is possible to get a loan from one of the other funds and pay it back over time with or without interest.

Motion by Minshall, 2nd by Davenport to adopt Resolution 2016-006 Inter Fund Loan for Depot repairs. \$30,000 will be loaded by the Local Option tax fund to be paid back in monthly payment in the amount of \$1250.00 for two years, or until balance is paid in full. No interest will be charged. Motion carried.

AB 17-04 Property at Jordan and SH 55

Council would like to put this off until owner of the property contacts the city again in the future.

AB 17-05 (Presentation) Water System Facility Plan Review

Mike Woodward from Mountain Waterworks presented the findings from the Water System Facility Plan Review. The City will then hold a Public Hearing on November 3rd to hear comment on the plan.

AB 17-06 (Workshop) Water System Bond

Kelly Dahlquist with CEDA and Mike Woodward presented a slide show on what items would be covered in with the bond and grant funds. Alternative 2, included a new well, pump, booster station upgrades and line upgrades throughout town. Alternative 1 was just the well and Alternative 3 was nothing at all. Water rates could go up but the City could work with changing their rate structure to possibly offset the increase. More information will be presented with Open Houses and public meetings prior to the bond election.

AB 17-08 Resolution 2016-007 Temporary Sewer Reduction

Clerk presented the requested Resolution for Mayor Koch to create a temporary sewer rate reduction to consist of a flat rate. This would still cover all expenses as well as loan payment and reserves. This is a temporary rate.

Motion by Minshall, 2nd Getto to approve Resolution 2016-007 for the Temporary Sewer Reduction effective November utility billing. Motion carried.

AB 17-09 Cell Tower Proposed Lease Amount

Horizon Communication has presented a lease amount of \$750 for the first provider and \$250 for each provider added per month with a review every five years. The Council was okay with this amount and instructed the Clerk to contact Horizon to move forward to the Conditional Use Application.

AB 17-10 Purchase of Storage Shed for Roads & Streets

It was presented to purchase a storage shed to place behind the maintenance shop to store things for the winter months and then when a permanent structure was built in the future to sell the shed or use for a different use. After discussion, it was decided that it would be a better use of funds to rent a storage space for the time needed. This would still be less than the purchase of a shed even if used for several years. Clerk will contact storage center in town to rent a storage.

ADDENDUM TO SEWAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM AND TREATMENT FACILITIES AGREEMENT

Between

CITY OF DONNELLY, IDAHO

And

NORTH LAKE RECREATIONAL SEWER AND WATER DISTRICT, VALLEY COUNTY, IDAHO

ADDENDUM TO SEWAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM AND TREATMENT FACILITIES AGREEMENT

This ADDENDUM TO SEWAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM AND TREATMENT FACILITIES AGREEMENT (this "Addendum"), dated as of ______, 201__, is entered by and between the City of Donnelly, Valley County, Idaho (the "City"), and the North Lake Recreational Sewer and Water District (the "District").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City and the District have previously entered into the Sewage Collection System and Treatment Facilities Agreement dated as of June 1, 2005 (the "Agreement"), respecting the repair and improvement to the City's sewer collection and treatment system (the "City Sewer System") and the expansion of the District's sewer collection and treatment system and operations (the "District Sewer System" and collectively with the City Sewer System, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, under the Agreement, the City makes certain pledges and promises to the District relating to the City Sewer System and the Project; and

WHEREAS, under Ordinance No. 135 adopted by the City on October 17, 1994 (the "Bond Ordinance"), the City issued its Parity Lien Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 1996B dated February 1, 1996, in the principal amount of \$217,400 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Bonds are secured by a first priority lien on the Net Revenues (as defined in the Bond Ordinance) of the City Sewer System; and

WHEREAS, to clarify and provide for the priority of the City's pledge of payment of the Bonds from Net Revenues of the City Sewer System, the City and District wish to amend the Agreement to provide that the Bonds continue to be valid and duly authorized obligations of the City, that the City's obligation to pay the United States Department of Agriculture, Rural Development under the Bond Ordinance as holder of the Bonds ("USDA") continues in full force and effect, and to confirm that the pledge of Net Revenues of the City Sewer System for payment of the Bonds is prior and senior to any and all pledges or promises of the City made under the Agreement, and further that the security of USDA under the Bonds shall not be diminished or jeopardized by any provision of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, to meet the USDA Minimum Suggested Contents of Management Agreements provided in RUS Bulletin 1780-8, the City and District wish to further amend the Agreement to require the District to: (1) provide monthly and annual reports to the City covering appropriate financial and operational statistics relating to the management and operation of the City Sewer System; (2) allow for the inspection of books and records of the District by the City and USDA relating to the City Sewer System; and (3) comply with all requirements of the USDA Loan and Grant Approval Conditions dated July 6, 1994, as amended (the "USDA Loan Conditions"), relating to the management and operation of the City Sewer System; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5.3 of the Agreement, the City and the District may amend their rights and obligation set forth in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, all things necessary to make this Addendum a valid agreement of the City and the District in accordance with terms of the Agreement have been done, and the execution and delivery hereof have been in all respects duly authorized by the City and the District; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the City and the District hereby further amend the Agreement as follows:

ARTICLE I

The Bonds shall continue as valid and duly authorized obligations of the City, that the City's obligation to pay the USDA as holder of the Bonds under the Bond Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect and that the pledge of Net Revenues (as defined in the Ordinance) of the City Sewer System for payment of the Bonds is prior and senior to any and all pledges or promises of the City made under the Agreement, and further that the security of USDA under the Bonds shall not be diminished or jeopardized by any provision of the Agreement. Any provision of the Agreement, as amended by this Addendum, contrary to the provisions of the preceding sentence shall not be enforceable.

ARTICLE II

The City and the District hereby agree that the District shall:

- (1) Provide to the City monthly reports of the financial and operational statistics relating to the City Sewer System by the fifteenth (15th) day of each month;
- (2) Provide to the City an annual report summarizing the financial and operational statistics relating to the City Sewer System during the previous calendar year within sixty (60) days of the last day of that previous calendar year;
- (3) Allow for the inspection of all books and records of the District by the City and USDA relating to the City Sewer System; and
- (4) Comply with all requirements of the USDA Loan Conditions relating to the management and operation of the City Sewer System.

ARTICLE III

All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
