Roll Call: 6:00 p.m. Sally Gilbert, George Dorris, Gene Tyler, Maggie Bryant and Larry Mangum were present. Quorum exists. Clerk Cami Hedges and Administrator Delta James were present.

PUBLIC HEARING

Sign Code 18.95 Amendments

Chairman Mangum opened the public hearing at 6:02 p.m.
Administrator recapped the amendments to the sign code per her staff report.

Mangum asked for supporters:

Paul Sevioan owner Roseberry Plaza spoke in favor of the changes to the sign code. He did not see any problems with changes and said that the Council has the real concerns as to enforcement. He stated to let the people advertise as they want to.

Sherry Gesirin owner of Long Valley Farm Service. Thanks the commission for the changes, but suggests that the City relax a little and look a little better. Common sense should take care of the issues.

Leon Renz – Brundage Realty like the changes however wants to see changing of the sign that is statically illuminated should be allowed to change five to ten times in a 24 hours period.

Mangum asked for anyone that was Neutral

Mary Jane Mangum representing Stinker Station and Steve Watts agrees with the amendments to the sign code. His main concern was that of the sign area and free-standing signs which were both addressed. Maybe the sign code should reflect what type of business it is to determine the regulations. He believes that rotating LED signs should be allowed (animated signs) and one size fits all is not always acceptable.

Callie Smith owner of Fly Trap Antiques and property would just like clarification on the what is a rotating sign, animated sign and prohibited sign. There are animated signs throughout the City for example OPEN signs and would like to see conformity and the sign violations enforced. Maybe way finding signs or directional signs would help for off premise signage.
